



Established on May 1, 1978, the National Maritime Polytechnic is the only government maritime training and research center in the Philippines. It became an attached agency to the Department of Labor and Employment with the signing of Executive Order 126 in 1987.

The NMP offers upgrading, specialized and safety courses for Filipino merchant marine officers, ratings, cadets and maritime faculty/trainers. NMP courses conform to international and national standards for maritime education and training (MET).

The second mandated function of the NMP is the conduct of relevant researches and studies on the latest maritime technologies and other related matters for the maritime industry.

Having earned the reputation as initiator of maritime programs, the NMP conceptualized the Philippine Journal on Maritime Education and Training (PJMET). An offshoot of the 1st Congress of Maritime Education and Training, the PJMET was launched in 2003 as the first maritime technical journal in the country and is published twice a year in cooperation with the Congress of Maritime Education and Training. It features studies and papers related to maritime education and training with local and foreign authors-writers.

Completed researches and studies of the NMP are also published in the journal.

The NMP welcomes articles and manuscripts on maritime training and education.
